SAVE OUR LOCAL POLICE OFFICER

Mapledurwell & Up Nately and Newnham Parishes

Hampshire Constabulary and the Police & Crime Commissioner plan to restructure the police coverage of Upton Grey & The Candovers, the beat covered by PC Andy Reid. The reorganisation plans will see us lose our dedicated Beat Officer.

This will have a direct effect on the neighbourhood policing that we currently enjoy and undoubtedly will lead to an increase in criminal activity.

With effect from April next year, it is proposed that PC Reid will relocate to Tadley Police Station from where he will be tasked as part of Basingstoke Rural South team. One constable per nine-hour shift will be responsible for an area covering Whitchurch (part of), Overton, Oakley and Upton Grey & The Candovers – an area of approximately 250 square miles.

Statement from PC Reid:

'As of March a new structure will be in place borne out of a need to make cuts to Force budgets. Intention will be that the beat will have a dedicated PCSO and that I will be part of a larger team to react to crime throughout the whole rural area. I will have responsibility for a large area combining a number a number of beats along with one other officer. Accepting that this is not founded upon improving service delivery but the impact of savings the force is having to make.'

- **The beat area of Upton Grey & The Candovers will lose its dedicated police resource**
- **There will be no proactive and preventative policing**
- **The local police should be extending the excellent and successful policing we have to other areas – not stopping it**
- **No consultation and no consideration of other ways of funding which must be the minimum before changes are made.**

MICHAEL ALLENBY

In Memoriam: Lieutenant Colonel The Viscount Allenby, 1931 -2014

'We are sorry to hear of the passing of Michael Allenby on October 3rd at the age of 83. Michael had a considerable involvement with the sport in the late eighties and nineties with the Junior Novice Regional Eventing programmes as well as the Junior British team.

'He started in 1988 as the Regional Coordinator for South East England, nurturing junior riders in the programme. He was considerably skilled in bringing out the best of the riders under his care. Michael took on the Junior Team Selectors Chairmanship in 1995. He took teams to four European Championships, winning team gold and individual gold at Blair Castle in 1996 and team gold and individual silver at the 1998 Europeans at Bialy Bor in Poland.

"Michael made a huge contribution to the sport, in particular to the Junior programme, and led by example," said BE Chief Executive Mike Etherington-Smith. "There will be many in the sport who have benefited from his experience, knowledge, and style and who will be forever grateful for all that he gave them at such a key time in their equestrian careers."

'More recently, Michael and his wife Sara owned Pauldarys Bamba with Amanda Taylor, competing up to one star.

'Michael was educated at Eton and at the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst. He was commissioned a lieutenant in the 11th Hussars (later the Royal Hussars), stationed in Malaya between 1953 and 1956. He then served as Aide-de-Camp to the Governor of Cyprus (1957-1958), Brigade Major of the 51st Brigade in Hong Kong (1967-1969) and commanded The Royal Yeomanry (TA) (1974-1977).

'After inheriting the title Viscount Allenby, of Megiddo and of Felixstowe in the county of Suffolk in 1984, he took his seat in the House of Lords in 1985. He served as a Deputy Speaker of the

LOCAL PLAN GOES BEFORE THE INSPECTOR

The final version of the Local Plan was submitted to the Planning Inspector on 9th October. It is our understanding that the Plan has not changed substantially from that used for public consultation in June.

The appointed Inspector, Mike Fox, will determine the timetable. The public examination is likely to be in January although there could be a pre-examination hearing in November or December.

Meanwhile Hart residents finally had a public meeting with Planning Minister, Brandon Lewis MP. However, there was very little comfort for Hook residents in their bid to protect against uncontrolled development. Despite a number of suggestions from residents, the answer was the same to all – it was Hart's fault due to their lack of Local Plan and there were no plans to change the process. Claims of 'localism' rang very hollow with the Hook residents.

The attitude from Brandon Lewis does not fill us with confidence for our meeting with him on 5th November.

It came as no surprise to hear that Communities Secretary, Eric Pickles, upheld the developer's appeal against BDBC's refusal of 425 houses on Razors Farm, Chineham. The argument that this application is premature was dismissed <http://www.solveloddon.org/>

ROWAN LODGE CAR PARK

A new car park on the greenfield site received planning permission from the Development Control Committee on Wednesday 24th September. Hours of use are restricted to 7.30am - 9pm.

The decision to approve was a marginal one and based on the fact that the NPPF is currently the senior planning document with a presumption in favour of approval – in particular it is felt that refusal may impact adversely on an established rural business.

Concerns were raised at the meeting regarding the effectiveness of screening which the plans show as 'biodiversity' hedging of a field maple / ash / oak / holly mix with specimen oak trees

The application decision notice requires Forest Care to submit a detailed landscaping proposal and lighting scheme for approval before work can start which must be within three years.

There will be some consultation at this stage and the Parish Council requests an additional mixed native hedge on all three field sides of the car park to comprise Blackthorn, Hawthorn, Hazel, Euonymus (spindle), Dogwood, Field Maple, Guelder Rose, Sweet Brier Rose and Dog Rose planted in a double row; if larger plants are used this will provide a dense hedge in just a few years.

The next Parish Council meeting is planned for Wednesday 26th November in the Old House at Home. Everyone is very welcome to attend.

POLICE UPDATE

Dear Residents

Sadly we have seen an increase in reported crime. Overnight of October 15th/16th

an outbuilding was broken into and another attempted burglary took place at two premises in Tunworth Road, Mapledurwell. At one, a large amount of garden equipment was stolen. If anyone was in Tunworth Road in the centre of the village area and saw anything or anyone suspicious please give me a call direct.

I wish to remind residents to please make sure your sheds have good security protection, please mark valuable items and photograph expensive property.

We have also experienced an increase of criminal damage to growing crops across the beat area where vehicles have been deliberately driven over them whilst people in them are searching and pursuing hares and deer.

Sadly this type of poaching incident is on the increase and while some may feel that poaching is not such a serious matter as other crimes, we are aware of a very distinctive link between this type of crime and burglary from outbuildings and theft from rural areas. These offences 'usually' take place at night so as always if anyone has any suspicions concerning vehicles or people please do give me a call.

Also as the nights draw in may I ask drivers to please check their lights on their vehicles as several have been seen recently with defective lights. I also urge residents to please leave lights on in their homes when they go out in the evenings.

UPDATE ON THE 'BOARDWALK' PROJECT – PATH CLOSURE



The Parish Council has received grants for the renovation and improvement of the boardwalk and footpath at the rear of the church and work is programmed to commence in early November for a period of four to six weeks.

As a result, it has been necessary to apply for a closure order for the footpath for the duration of the construction work. It is planned to build a 1.2m wide wooden walkway, replacing the existing narrow and rotting sections. There will also be an improved gravel approach path at each end. More details soon.

Dear Friends

'When someone you love becomes a memory, the memory becomes a treasure.' These words are on a sympathy card that I bought recently. I have

no idea who wrote them but having recently lost a very dear friend my memory box now contains another treasure. When my children were little they each had a 'special things' box: the 'gold' medal won in the primary school Olympics, a coin minted for the Queen's silver jubilee, but also little notes and cards from Grandma, kept safe and treasured after she had died. Memories are precious. They are not always golden but they are always part of the jigsaw that makes us who we are today. November is always my month for writing to you about remembering, containing as it does the church festivals of All Saints and also All Souls. In our parish we shall celebrate All Saints in our services on November 2nd. Then a week later on November 9th we shall join with the nation in our formal service of Remembrance in the morning, followed by In Loving Memory that afternoon.

This year is of course especially poignant as we commemorate 100 years since the beginning of the First World War. We have been reminded of its horror through drama and documentary, music and art, and we have heard stories of great valour and honour but also tragedy and heartbreak. Our churches contain memorials to those who lost their lives, read out year-by-year. Greywell Village Hall also contains the names of those who served and returned safely. None of these little communities was untouched by that war – memories were left behind to treasure.

As always I have taken a lot of funerals this year: many of those who died have been very elderly and had reached the proper ending of their life, but others have been too young, and taken unexpectedly. And they have been from across the echelons of our society, rich and poor, powerful and lowly. But I know that neither money or influence are any protection against grief and each one is remembered, honoured and commended to God with the same care and dignity. Each one will be remembered too at In Loving Memory. I shall be adding my friend Cathy to the list of names read out and if you would like someone special to you remembered, then please let me have their name in writing in advance of the service. We can't live in the past but it is good to take time for treasured memories, thanksgiving and peace.

Mobile Library Services to continue in Greywell, Water End and Newnham

As at January 2014 the Hampshire Library Service was required to reduce its budget by £300,000 by 31st March 2015. One measure was to reduce the Mobile Library Service by taking out the 115 least well used of the 345 stops across Hampshire.

Following a three month consultation, the proposals were altered so that 17 of these 115 stops will be retained and 98 withdrawn. The Greywell Village Hall and Water End stops were not included in the planned cuts but the Newnham Green stop originally was and is now to be retained.
