In Touch Handyman Service

The In Touch Handyman Service is a low cost, minor home repairs service for disabled people and people over 60 and is supported by Hampshire County Council.



The service can help with minor repairs and jobs that tradesmen might not do, and which take less than a couple of hours. This could include minor plumbing and carpentry work such as fixing a leaking tap, or home security and safety jobs such as replacing a lock or fitting a security chain.

The service covers the whole Hampshire area, and can be contacted for free advice and guidance. There is a labour charge of £12 an hour (plus VAT) for customers who are over 60 or disabled and this is subsidised by Hampshire County Council. A further discount is available for clients in receipt of means tested benefit.

You can supply the materials, or they can be supplied by the handyman. If you do not qualify for the subsidised cost, the service will cost £20 per hour (plus VAT). For more information telephone 0845 459 5036 or email hantshia@familymosaic.co.uk.

Neighbourhood Watch

Litter Campaign



Litter has been noted as an emerging issue with hotspots in Hart and a blight to those who live near and use the land affected.

To combat this, there are operations in place involving the Police and Accredited Community Safety Officers where anyone caught littering will receive a fixed penalty notice of £75, or a warning letter if under 16.

As well as signage, education and advice, it is hoped that these operations will drum the message that litter will not be tolerated by the residents of Hart.

Where Is Your Child?



We will be launching our 'Where is your Child' campaign in September. This is an awareness campaign targeting parents to be aware of where their children are, what they are doing and to remind them of their responsibilities as parents.

This period in previous years has historically seen a rise in criminal damage incidents, and also takes into account the two high priority evenings of Halloween and Guy Fawkes Night.

There will be 3 strands to the project focusing on advertising, enforcement and education. Increased patrolling will be carried out by officers. If individuals are found to be out and to have committed offences, they will be returned home at the time of the incident. Letters will also be sent to parents of children who have been stopped, detailing what is expected of them. In the run up to Halloween and Guy Fawkes Night, school visits will be carried out to discuss the consequences of misbehaving.
